Annulment Qualifications

The idea of annulling your marriage is based on the premise that the marriage was never valid. Occasionally referred to as nullified marriages, court-granted annulments are usually based on at least one of the following factors:

- Fraud
- Incest
- Bigamy
- Impotence
- Lack of consent
- Mental illness or insanity
- Influence of drugs or alcohol

Courts will require evidence supporting one or more of these factors when considering an annulment request. For me to present compelling arguments on your behalf, it is essential that you are prepared to share factual details during our consultations.

For those seeking marital dissolutions for religious reasons, your church may have procedures in place beyond the legal processes. Persons of faith should consult with their clergy prior to moving forward with court-granted annulment, separation or divorce.
